	Procedure:			
5 min.	Before you Begin:			
	Write "Workplace Entry Program" on the whiteboard.			
	2. Instruct the participants that they will be working in pairs.			
	3. Each pair will be given a question sheet, the Workplace Entry Program flyer, and information sheet.			
	 Each pair will first look at the Workplace Entry Program flyer and answer the questions. 			
	5. The participants will take turns asking each other questions.			
	6. Afterwards, look at the detailed information sheet.			
10-15 min.	7. Next, as a whole group (whole class), the facilitator will pose questions to the participants. The participants will share their responses.			
	For the advanced level, ask the participants to create 10 questions of their own concerning the Workplace Entry Program information.

Workplace Entry Program

Eligibility Criteria:

- 1. Between 18 and 30 years of age (inclusive)
- 2. Canadian Language Benchmarks:
 - minimum Level 3 (Listening and Speaking)
 - minimum Level 3 or 4 (Reading and Writing)
- 3. Unemployed immigrants who are seeking entry level positions that might involve:
 - standing during the work day
 - working shifts (days, evenings or nights)
 - physical labour
 - cold work conditions
- 4. Candidates must be prepared to get a job
- 5. Permanent Residents Only

Qualified youth participants will be eligible for a 30 hour per week training allowance.

Class Dates:

April 15 - May 25, 2011 June 9 - July 14, 2011 July 29 - September 2, 2011 September 20- October 25, 2011 November 9- December 14, 2011

Class Length: 5 weeks, Monday to Friday from 9 AM to 4PM

Program Description:

This program will provide participants with limited English language and work experience with the understanding of employer's expectations and the workplace culture in Canada. It is designed to fully address the following topics:

- Health and safety awareness
- Ability to find and maintain a job
- Interview skills
- Computer Skills (Computer Lending Library-CLL)
- Workplace communication skills

A screening interview is required prior to the start date shown above. Only those who are accepted will be invited to an orientation session.

Note: The Immigrant Centre Employment Team will also work with youth candidates who do not meet the class' eligibility criteria but still need jobs. In this case, individuals can have English Language Benchmarks lower than three (3).
