

Access English Centre Immigrant Centre Manitoba High Beginner Level: Work-out Activity Supermarket Dialogue 60 minutes



Objective/Goal: This speaking activity is a "Think-Pair-Share" activity. It is a good opportunity for participants to practise dialogue with one another. The participants will be describing the locations of various food items by viewing, listening, and speaking. Materials: Facilitator needs: Participants need: - whiteboard and whiteboard markers - Optional: computer with internet Supermarket Pictures (cut from food magazines or access flyers) - screen - projector Optional: (for reference)Oxford Picture Dictionary Procedure: **Before the activity:** 1. Write the following phrases on the whiteboard: Customer: I'm looking for _____ Clerk: It's in aisle____, on the _____shelf, beside the Introduction-2. **Review** commonly used prepositions such as above, next to, between, under, below, beneath, beside, etc. Write them on the whiteboard. 3. **Preposition Demonstration**- With volunteers, **demonstrate** the prepositions (ex. above, next to, between, under, etc.) Ex. The facilitator stands beside the volunteer: Kara. The facilitator asks, "Where am I?" The facilitator asks the whole group which preposition or word describes his/her location to Kara.

Ex. Participant: Nadia says," You are beside Kara." or "You are next to Kara", etc.

- 4. Give each pair a supermarket picture. If needed, give each pair an Oxford Picture Dictionary or have one ready for reference.
- 5. As a whole group, **go over** the supermarket picture; **ask** the participants what they see. **Demonstrate** as a whole group (whole class).
- 6. Explain the activity.
- 7. Pair participants together.
- 8. Instruct each pair to look at their supermarket picture, first. Have the participants *think* about what they see.
- 9. In each **pair**, one person is clerk and the other is the customer.
- 10. The "customer" chooses one of the food items.
- 11. The "clerk" tells the customer where the food item is found.
- 12. Now **switch** roles.
- 13. Each pair **shares** their dialogues with the class. The supermarket pictures can be displayed for the class. Optional: The facilitator can post the supermarket pictures via projector.

Extension Activities:

- *Extension activities are alternative or extra activities that can be done to supplement the main activity, if there is extra time. They can also be done for the next class as a review of previous vocabulary or conversation.
 - **A.** Using the same words, instead of saying synonyms: antonyms (words that are opposite Ex. big-small, tall-short, fat-skinny, cats- dogs, etc.) can be





said.

B. Have a competition using a timer, time both groups, the group that finished first by identifying a different synonym for the starting word. The last person can ring the bell-first –WINS! The facilitator needs to closely monitor both groups.
