



#### Objective/Goal:

This is a fun activity for participants to practice on how to prepare for difficult situations in the winter. The goal is to familiarize the participants on how to ask for help in an emergency, how to offer help, and how to provide advice. Participants will work together in pairs or as a group to find out the answers to the questions.

#### Materials:

**Participants need**: Pictures of Set A and Set B, vocabulary list and Activity sheet, pencils/pens

#### Facilitator needs:

- whiteboard
- whiteboard markers

Procedure:

Warm-up 15 min Work-out 60 min Cool-down 15 min

### Before the Activity:

I. Warm-up Activity: Look at the pictures on page 3, then preteach/review the following words: (15 minutes)

icy road snow storm slippery blizzard temperature
weather warning car battery injury location police

<u>exchange driver license</u> <u>drive slow</u> <u>prepare for winter</u>

#### <u>have a car accident</u>

- (1) Lead the whole group by reading the words out aloud with the participants several times.
- (2) Ask the participants to work in pairs to match up the words with the right pictures. One participant reads a word, the other one finds the right picture to match up with the word. (Worksheet set A)
- (3) Check out the answers by pulling whole group together when the





participants finish their matching activity.

**Extra activity**: Encourage the whole group to answer the questions such as "What do you prepare for driving in winter?", and "What do you do driving in winter?", or "What do you do in a car accident?"

II. Work-out Activity: The goal is to have the participants to familiarize themselves on how to ask for help in an emergency. Review the questions first. Also review "Wh-questions and how to report problems properly. (Think, pair and share) (20 minutes). For example:

"Excuse me. Can you help me? "My car is stuck on the road."

"Excuse me. Can you help me? "The battery of the car is dead."

"Excuse me. Can you phone 911 for me? I don't know where I am at now.

Do you know the name of the street?"

- 1) **First Show and Tell**: show the pictures (Worksheet Set B) one at a time to the whole group. Use simple sentences to describe what they see in the picture. Encourage the participants to describe the picture with you if they can.
- 2) **Second whole group activity:** invite two participants to work with you to describe a few pictures by answering your questions such as "How can I help? "What's wrong with this car?" "Where is your car?"
- 3) Third After asking the participants the questions, wait for the participants to think about how to answer the questions first, and then ask them to work in pairs to practice how to ask for help.
- 4) Fourth whole group activity Play Cross-out game: Give the participants the worksheet and ask them to cross out the words and phrases you read to them.

## **III. Cool Down Activity:**

**BINGO Game: whole group activity:** ask the participants to play BINGO game together to recap what they have learned.
